During cataract surgery the cloudy natural lens is removed and an artificial lens is placed in the eye. Although most patients find that their vision will be improved after cataract surgery even without glasses, many patients will still need eyeglasses for different activities such as reading or with fine details at distance and near. There are different intraocular lens (IOL) options available depending on your preferences and the measurements and health of your eye.
